Getting this wrong can have consequences, including complaints, regulatory sanctions, legal action and reputational harm, so it is important to have the right advice.

- **Privacy Notices**

Individuals must be provided with information about the processing of their personal data and the rights available to them, and the most effective way to do this is by a compliant Privacy Notice.

- **Data Subject Rights**

Individuals have various rights in relation to their personal data, including rights of access (subject access request), erasure and objection, which data controllers must respond to within time limits.

- **Data Breach Management**

Certain types of data breach must be reported to the Data Protection Commission within 72 hours of becoming aware and, in some circumstances, the affected individuals must also be informed.

- **Contracts and Agreements**

Depending on the processing activities and third party involved, a data processing contract, model clause contract (international transfers) or data sharing agreement may be required or advisable.

- **Accountability Measures**

Accountability is a core principle of the GDPR, requiring appropriate technical and organisational measures in place to demonstrate compliance, including policies, procedures, controls and records.

- **Data Protection Impact Assessment (DPIA)**

The GDPR requires a formal DPIA to be carried out by a data controller before any processing operations which are likely to result in a high risk to the rights and interests of individuals.

- **Compliance Reviews**

Having accurate information about GDPR compliance levels is essential for organisational risk management and strategic planning, whether a high-level gap analysis or a more extensive audit.

- **Training**

Raising data protection awareness is not just about staff knowledge and capacity, it is a key part of the GDPR's accountability requirements.
